## Applications Information

## Product Description

The EL5191 is a current-feedback operational amplifier that offers a wide -3 dB bandwidth of 1 GHz and a low supply current of 9 mA per amplifier. The EL5191 works with supply voltages ranging from a single 5 V to 10 V and they are also capable of swinging to within 1 V of either supply on the output. Because of their current-feedback topology, the EL5191 does not have the normal gain-bandwidth product associated with voltage-feedback operational amplifiers. Instead, its -3 dB bandwidth to remain relatively constant as closed-loop gain is increased. This combination of high bandwidth and low power, together with aggressive pricing make the EL5191 the ideal choice for many low-power/highbandwidth applications such as portable, handheld, or battery-powered equipment.
For varying bandwidth needs, consider the EL5192 with 600 MHz on a 6 mA supply current or the EL5193 with 300 MHz on a 4 mA supply current. Versions include single, dual, and triple amp packages with 5 Ld SOT-23, 16 Ld QSOP, and 8 Ld or 16 Ld SOIC outlines.

## Power Supply Bypassing and Printed Circuit Board Layout

As with any high frequency device, good printed circuit board layout is necessary for optimum performance. Low impedance ground plane construction is essential. Surface mount components are recommended, but if leaded components are used, lead lengths should be as short as possible. The power supply pins must be well bypassed to reduce the risk of oscillation. The combination of a $4.7 \mu \mathrm{~F}$ tantalum capacitor in parallel with a $0.01 \mu \mathrm{~F}$ capacitor has been shown to work well when placed at each supply pin.

For good AC performance, parasitic capacitance should be kept to a minimum, especially at the inverting input. (See "Capacitance at the Inverting Input" on page 15.) Even when ground plane construction is used, it should be removed from the area near the inverting input to minimize any stray capacitance at that node. Carbon or Metal-Film resistors are acceptable with the Metal-Film resistors giving slightly less peaking and bandwidth because of additional series inductance. Use of sockets, particularly for the SOIC package, should be avoided if possible. Sockets add parasitic inductance and capacitance which will result in additional peaking and overshoot.

## Disable/Power-Down

The EL5191A amplifier can be disabled placing its output in a high impedance state. When disabled, the amplifier supply current is reduced to $<150 \mu \mathrm{~A}$. The EL5191A is disabled when its $\overline{C E}$ pin is pulled up to within 1 V of the positive supply. Similarly, the amplifier is enabled by floating or pulling its $\overline{\mathrm{CE}}$ pin to at least 3 V below the positive supply. For $\pm 5 \mathrm{~V}$ supply, this means that an EL5191A amplifier will be
enabled when $\overline{\mathrm{CE}}$ is 2 V or less, and disabled when $\overline{\mathrm{CE}}$ is above 4 V . Although the logic levels are not standard TTL, this choice of logic voltages allows the EL5191A to be enabled by tying $\overline{\mathrm{CE}}$ to ground, even in 5 V single supply applications. The $\overline{\mathrm{CE}}$ pin can be driven from CMOS outputs.

## Capacitance at the Inverting Input

Any manufacturer's high-speed voltage- or current-feedback amplifier can be affected by stray capacitance at the inverting input. For inverting gains, this parasitic capacitance has little effect because the inverting input is a virtual ground. But for non-inverting gains, this capacitance (in conjunction with the feedback and gain resistors) creates a pole in the feedback path of the amplifier. This pole, if low enough in frequency, has the same destabilizing effect as a zero in the forward open-loop response. The use of large value feedback and gain resistors exacerbates the problem by further lowering the pole frequency (increasing the possibility of oscillation.)

The EL5191 has been optimized with a $250 \Omega$ feedback resistor. With the high bandwidth of these amplifiers, these resistor values might cause stability problems when combined with parasitic capacitance, thus ground plane is not recommended around the inverting input pin of the amplifier.

## Feedback Resistor Values

The EL5191 has been designed and specified at a gain of +2 with $R_{F}$ approximately $250 \Omega$. This value of feedback resistor gives 600 MHz of -3 dB bandwidth at $A_{V}=2$ with about 2 dB of peaking. With $A_{V}=-2$, that same $R_{F}$ gives 450 MHz of bandwidth with 0.6 dB of peaking. Since the EL5191 is a current-feedback amplifier, it is also possible to change the value of $R_{F}$ to get more bandwidth. As seen in the curve of Frequency Response for Various $R_{F}$ and $R_{G}$, bandwidth and peaking can be easily modified by varying the value of the feedback resistor.

Because the EL5191 is a current-feedback amplifier, its gain-bandwidth product is not a constant for different closedloop gains. This feature actually allows the EL5191 to maintain about the same -3dB bandwidth. As gain is increased, bandwidth decreases slightly while stability increases. Since the loop stability is improving with higher closed-loop gains, it becomes possible to reduce the value of $R_{F}$ below the specified $250 \Omega$ and still retain stability, resulting in only a slight loss of bandwidth with increased closed-loop gain.

## Supply Voltage Range and Single-Supply Operation

The EL5191 has been designed to operate with supply voltages having a span of greater than 5 V and less than 10 V . In practical terms, this means that the EL5191 will operate on dual supplies ranging from $\pm 2.5 \mathrm{~V}$ to $\pm 5 \mathrm{~V}$. With singlesupply, the EL5191 will operate from 5 V to 10 V .

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As supply voltages continue to decrease, it becomes necessary to provide input and output voltage ranges that can get as close as possible to the supply voltages. The EL5191 has an input range which extends to within 2V of either supply. So, for example, on $\pm 5 \mathrm{~V}$ supplies, the EL5191 has an input range which spans $\pm 3 \mathrm{~V}$. The output range of the EL5191 is also quite large, extending to within 1 V of the supply rail. On a $\pm 5 \mathrm{~V}$ supply, the output is therefore capable of swinging from -4 V to +4 V . Single-supply output range is larger because of the increased negative swing due to the external pull-down resistor to ground.

## Video Performance

For good video performance, an amplifier is required to maintain the same output impedance and the same frequency response as DC levels are changed at the output. This is especially difficult when driving a standard video load of $150 \Omega$, because of the change in output current with DC level. Previously, good differential gain could only be achieved by running high idle currents through the output transistors (to reduce variations in output impedance.) These currents were typically comparable to the entire 9 mA supply current of each EL5191 amplifier. Special circuitry has been incorporated in the EL5191 to reduce the variation of output impedance with current output. This results in dG and dP specifications of $0.035 \%$ and $0.04^{\circ}$, while driving $150 \Omega$ at a gain of 2.
Video performance has also been measured with a $500 \Omega$ load at a gain of +1 . Under these conditions, the EL5191 has dG and dP specifications of $0.02 \%$ and $0.02^{\circ}$, respectively.

## Output Drive Capability

In spite of its low 9mA of supply current, the EL5191 is capable of providing a minimum of $\pm 95 \mathrm{~mA}$ of output current. With a minimum of $\pm 95 \mathrm{~mA}$ of output drive, the EL5191 is capable of driving $50 \Omega$ loads to both rails, making it an excellent choice for driving isolation transformers in telecommunications applications.

## Driving Cables and Capacitive Loads

When used as a cable driver, double termination is always recommended for reflection-free performance. For those applications, the back-termination series resistor will decouple the EL5191 from the cable and allow extensive capacitive drive. However, other applications may have high capacitive loads without a back-termination resistor. In these applications, a small series resistor (usually between $5 \Omega$ and $50 \Omega$ ) can be placed in series with the output to eliminate most peaking. The gain resistor ( $\mathrm{R}_{\mathrm{G}}$ ) can then be chosen to make up for any gain loss which may be created by this additional resistor at the output. In many cases it is also possible to simply increase the value of the feedback resistor $\left(R_{F}\right)$ to reduce the peaking.

## Current Limiting

The EL5191 has no internal current-limiting circuitry. If the output is shorted, it is possible to exceed the Absolute Maximum Rating for output current or power dissipation, potentially resulting in the destruction of the device.

## Power Dissipation

With the high output drive capability of the EL5191, it is possible to exceed the $+125^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$ Absolute Maximum junction temperature under certain very high load current conditions. Generally speaking when $R_{L}$ falls below about $25 \Omega$, it is important to calculate the maximum junction temperature (TJMAX) for the application to determine if power supply voltages, load conditions, or package type need to be modified for the EL5191 to remain in the safe operating area. These parameters are calculated as follows:
